Steps to File the FAFSA

- a.) Students and their parents must apply for a personal identification number (PIN) from the U.S. Department of Education, www.pin.ed.gov. A FAFSA is not considered complete until both the parent and student have updated it with their PIN. This is considered the online signature form.
- b.) Upon receiving a PIN, students complete the FAFSA online, www.fafsa.ed.gov and must include Studio Incamminati's **Federal Code 04232000**
- c.) When filing FAFSA on the web, students are encouraged to use the IRS DRT (Data Retrieval Tool), which allows the U.S. Department of Education to access tax year data directly from the IRS, rather than the student providing the data. This ensures the most accurate aid award and may satisfy the need for further tax information if selected for Federal Verification.
- d.) After submitting the FAFSA, students receive notification from the Federal Government in the form of a Student Aid Report (SAR). The SAR contains the Expected Family Contribution and Pell Grant and Federal Direct Loans eligibility. Students must review carefully and correct any errors found.
